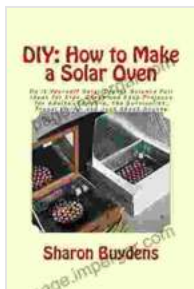

Instructions

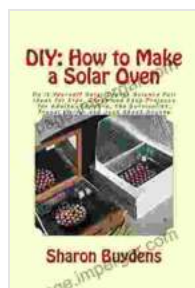
1. Start by cutting a hole in the top of the cardboard box. The hole should be big enough to fit the aluminum foil.

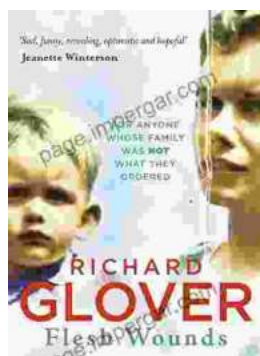
