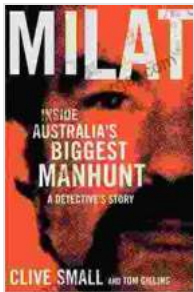


Inside Australia's Biggest Manhunt: Detective Story

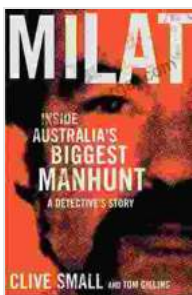
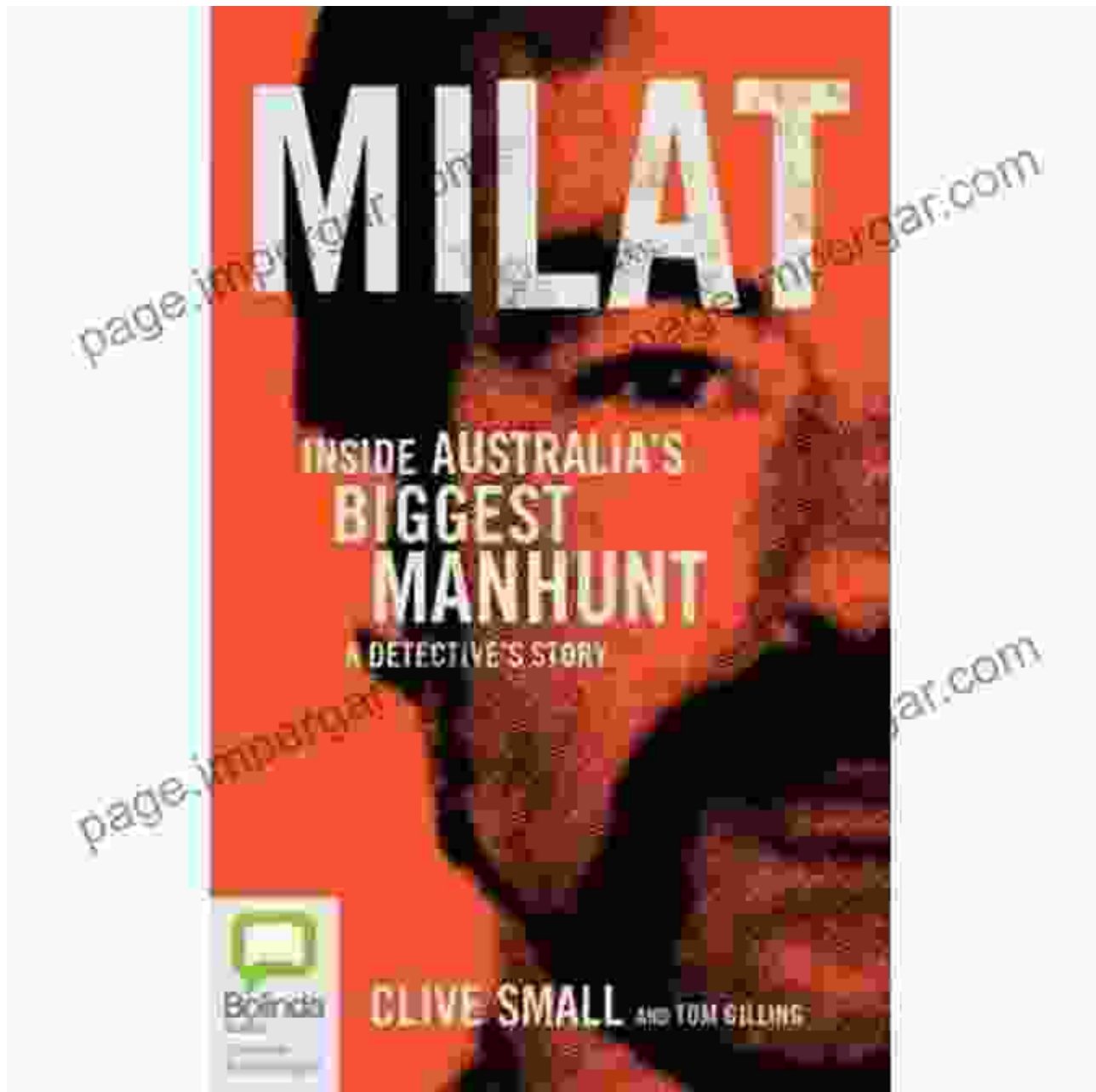

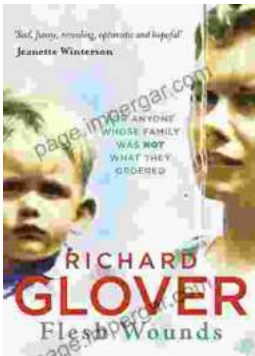
