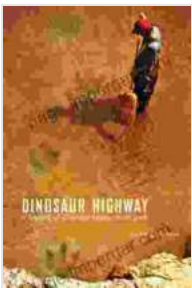

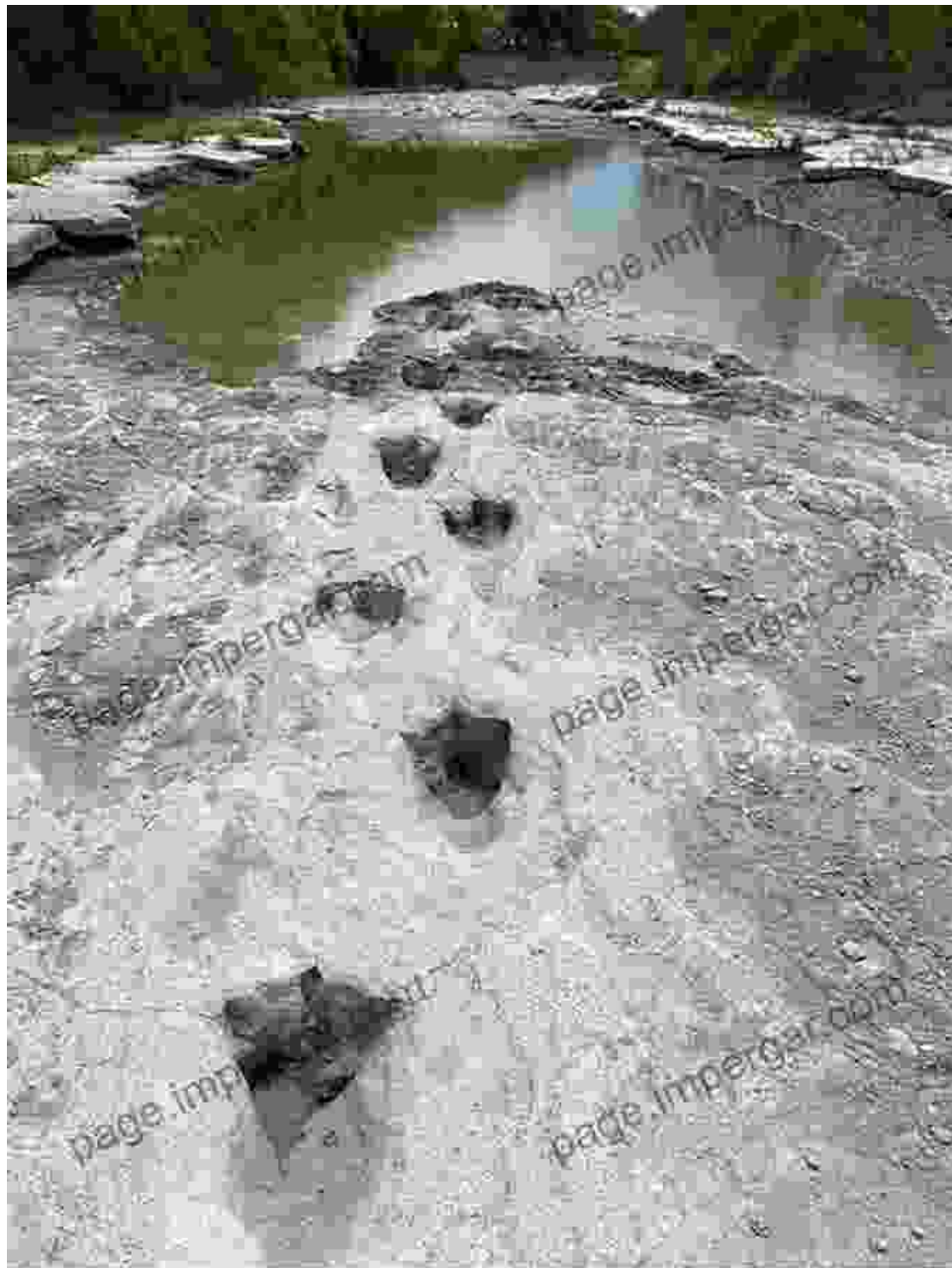

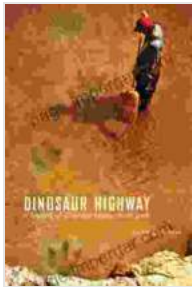
Planning Your Adventure

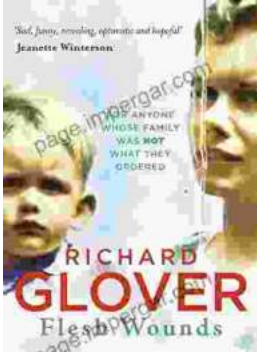

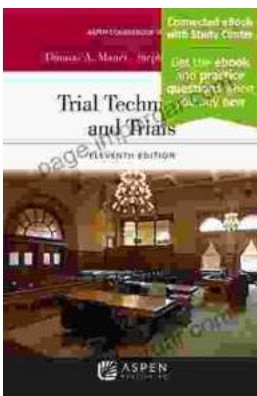
